He is a sweet boy who was a stud for a puppy mill that lived out of a 5th wheel trailer. He is so laid back and a huge love. He went through the treatment and is a month long recover for him of no movement. They run arsenic through the veins in order to kill the worms, UGH..... Pray for him and his health & finding his forever home.



Teddie, bottom left, was dropped off at a night deposit box at the Denver Dumb Friends League at the age of 10 weeks. We were told he had a Heart Murmur and that was why they were giving him to RMNR, so we could help with his medical needs. We found a family that said they

RECIPE FOR OUR 4-LEGGED FRIENDS**Dog Biscuits - from Christina Rutland**

Pumpkin	Turkey broth
3 eggs	Peanut Butter
Honey	Whole Wheat (or barley) flour
Fresh parsley	

Bake the pumpkin then scoop out the meat. Put it in a blender with 3 eggs, a little honey, handful fresh parsley and turkey broth. Pour into a big bowl. Then scoop a mess of peanut butter into a 4 cup pyrex, add the turkey broth and heat it up so the PB melts enough to mix in. Mix that into the big bowl with the pumpkin/broth/egg/honey mix. Pour that liguidy goop into another big bowl and add enough whole wheat (or barley) flour and mix it until it can be patted out on a cutting board and cut into cookies. I bake slow (275 degrees) for a long time, a couple of hours, or until they are real hard and dry. Your Newfies will love you for it!!
